The following information pertains to the main evaluations that will concern your child during the current school year.

Cycle 2 2018-2019 School Year	
Main evaluations	
English Language Arts	<p>By the end of each term, students will be evaluated on their reading and writing skills. The students' knowledge will also be evaluated on a regular basis through different means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rubrics, Evaluation Situations (ES) – Grade 4, Reading Assessments, teacher observations, teacher judgment, running records, tests. <p>Uses language to communicate and learn (33%) Reads and listens to spoken, written and media texts (33%) Produces written and media texts (34%)</p>
Mathematics	<p>During the school year, students will be evaluated on their ability to solve situational problems and use mathematical reasoning. Situational problems will be modeled first term and reported on the report card terms 2 and 3. Student's mathematical knowledge will also be evaluated on a regular basis using these tools:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tests, quizzes, rubrics, teacher observations, teacher judgment. <p>Solves a situational problem (30%)- will not be reported on in Term 1 Uses mathematical reasoning (70%)</p>
French as Second Language (immersion)	<p>At the end of each term, students will be evaluated on their reading and writing skills. Oral communication will be evaluated and will be encouraged in the classroom by the teacher. The following tools will be used:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rubriques, grilles d'observation, tests de compréhension de lecture, dictées sans faute, situations d'apprentissage et d'évaluation. <p>Communicates in French (34%) Understands oral and written text in French (33%) Produces oral and written text in French (33%)</p>
Ethics & Religious Culture	<p>At the end of term 2 and 3 only, students will be evaluated on their ability to reflect on ethical questions, to demonstrate an understanding of the phenomenon of religion and to engage in dialogue. The teachers will use various tools to evaluate students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teacher observations, anecdotal notes, teacher judgment, class participation, and projects.
Arts plastiques	<p>At the end of each term, students will be evaluated on the production of images for intended viewers. They will also exercise critical judgment when appreciating a work of art, a traditional artistic object, a media image or a classmate's production. Evaluation tools used:</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Production of art work in class, activities related to appreciation of art.
Physical Education	<p>By the end of the school year, students will acquire a repertoire of knowledge and skills that will allow them to interact with others in different physical activity settings, to perform movement skills in different physical activity settings and to adopt a healthy and active lifestyle. Evaluation will be based on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Skills tests, self-evaluations, teacher judgment, teacher observations, rubrics and a health portfolio.
Science & Technology	<p>By the end of each term, students will have explored scientific and technological activities. This way, they will be able to communicate and propose explanation for or solutions to scientific or technological problems. Evaluation will be based on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research projects, assignments, tests, quizzes, presentations, experiments, lab reports, rubrics, teacher judgment, teacher observations and reflective questioning and class discussions.
Social Sciences	<p>By the end of the school year, students will have studied societies from 1500 to today. The knowledge acquired will help them understand the organization of a society in its territory. As well, they will be able to interpret the changes that could occur in a society and its territory. Evaluation will be based on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tests, quizzes, class participation, teacher observation, projects, assignments, presentations, rubrics, and teacher judgment.
Art dramatique	<p>By the end of the school year, students will have invented and interpreted short scenes as well as appreciated dramatic works, personal productions in addition to those of classmates.</p>

Comments on learning:

For each subject, space is reserved in the report card for teachers to provide any necessary information regarding your child's strengths, challenges and progress. Different means may also be used to promote communication with you: notes in the school agenda, e-mails, assignments sent home, presentation of your child's portfolio, etc.

Also note that you will receive the following official communications during the school year:

Official communications	
First written communication	By mid-October 2018, you will receive the first written communication, which will include an evaluation on your child’s learning and behavior.
First report card	By the week of November 19 th , 2018, you will receive the first report card. This report card will cover the period from August 30 th to November 8 and will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Second report card	By the week of February 26, 2019, you will receive the second report card. This report card will cover the period from November 12, 2018 to February 15, 2019 and will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Third report card	In July, 2019, the final report card will be made available to you. It will cover the period from February 19, 2019, to the end of the year and will count for 60% of the final mark for the year.
